A noun is a person, place, or a thing. Many of these nouns are physical, and can be experienced by your five senses e.g cake. These types of nouns are called **concrete nouns**. Some nouns, however, cannot be experienced physically. These things can't be seen, touched, smelled, heard, or tasted - e.g love and faith. These are called **abstract nouns**.
