The children finally found a game they all wanted to play. Can you guess what it is? If you work the puzzle below, you will find out!



# **How Does Your Garden Grow?**



"The weather is perfect today," says Trina. "I hope I can break my record."


Trina and several of her friends are getting ready to take turns flying their gliders.




## **Twin Words**
