

Practical Child Pedestrian Safety Training

This scheme is offered to selected primary schools in socially deprived areas. The scheme has proved to be an effective way for children in Primary 3, 4 and 5 to gain and develop pedestrian skills, observe dangers and practice crossing roads safely via supervised training walks in their local area. The scheme uses Skooter and Hattie workbooks for the classroom training. These workbooks target pedestrian related issues and contain lots of activities including quizzes, word searches and spot the difference.
